



Part XXI IAPUC Membership Standards and Fee Regulations

Chapter I General Provisions

Article 1 Purposes and Basis

These Regulations are formulated for the following purposes:

- (1) To establish the membership classification system, admission qualifications and approval procedures of IAPUC;
- (2) To clarify the rights, obligations and interests of all types of members;
- (3) To build a fair, transparent and sustainable fee standard system and payment management system;
- (4) To ensure the standardized operation and continuous optimization of the membership system;
- (5) To clarify the institutional correlation between IAPUC membership qualification and IQA accreditation qualification, and establish the core principle that **full membership is the foundation of accreditation**.

These Regulations are formulated on the basis of:

- Relevant provisions on the membership system stipulated in the IAPUC Constitution;
- Prevailing practices of membership management of international non-profit organizations;
- Membership systems of international educational associations and accreditation bodies including AACSB, AMBA & BGA, and ACBSP.

Article 2 Membership Classification and Hierarchical Relationship

IAPUC membership is divided into the following categories:

Membership Hierarchy and Progressive Logic:

Associate Member → Full Member → Accredited Member

(No accreditation eligibility) → (Eligible for IQA accreditation) → (IQA accreditation obtained)

Note: Individual members may come from any of the above institutional member categories, and their individual membership rights shall not be affected by the membership hierarchy of their affiliated institutions.

1. Full membership serves as the foundation for accredited membership. No institution may apply for IQA accreditation without first obtaining IAPUC full membership. Direct application for IQA accreditation without full membership qualification is prohibited.
2. Automatic upgrade upon accreditation acquisition. Full members who obtain IQA accreditation (including provisional accreditation, formal accreditation and full accreditation) shall be automatically upgraded to accredited members without additional application procedures.
3. Associate members are ineligible for accreditation application. Associate members intending to apply for IQA accreditation must first apply for and obtain full membership status after meeting all full membership qualification requirements. Core criteria such as degree-granting qualifications shall not be exempted during the upgrade process.
4. Membership downgrade upon accreditation invalidation. If an accredited member's accreditation status becomes invalid, expired or revoked, its membership shall be automatically downgraded to full member status, provided that the institution continues to meet full membership qualification requirements. If the institution no longer satisfies full membership criteria, it shall voluntarily apply for a downgrade to

associate member status or withdraw from IAPUC membership within a specified period.

Article 3 Basic Principles

Membership management shall adhere to the following basic principles:

Principle	Core Connotation
Voluntary Participation	All membership applications are voluntary except for automatic membership upgrade triggered by accreditation acquisition.
Genuine Qualification	Applicants shall truthfully submit legal qualifications and relevant information for membership application; false declaration is prohibited.
Hierarchical Progression	IQA accreditation application is premised on full membership; full members are automatically upgraded to accredited members upon accreditation approval; associate members must upgrade to full members prior to submitting any accreditation application.
Non-Discrimination	Membership applications shall not be discriminated against on the basis of region, institutional scale, education level, religious belief or political stance, with consistent review standards applied under equal conditions.
Right and Obligation Equivalence	The rights enjoyed by members shall match their fee payment obligations.

Chapter II Membership Admission Qualifications

Article 4 Full Membership Qualifications

Institutions applying for IAPUC full membership shall meet all of the following criteria simultaneously:

(1) Legitimate school operation: The applicant is a private university, private college or private higher vocational education institution legally registered or licensed to operate in its country or region, with legitimate degree-granting rights or equivalent qualifications.

(2) Complete training cycle: The institution has completed at least one full student

training cycle (from enrollment to graduation). For newly established institutions with long academic systems and high degree levels that have not yet completed a full training cycle, they may be admitted as full members under probation upon special evaluation and approval by the Membership Qualification Review Committee. Probationary full members shall enjoy all full membership rights except the right to apply for accreditation, and will obtain unrestricted full membership upon completion of a full training cycle at the end of the probation period. Newly established institutions failing to complete a full training cycle and obtain special evaluation approval may first apply for associate membership and upgrade to full membership after meeting relevant criteria.

(3) Concept recognition: The institution recognizes IAPUC's mission and core values, commits to continuous improvement of school-running quality, and accepts the constraints of the IAPUC Constitution and membership codes.

(4) Standardized operation: The institution has not received major regulatory penalties or public condemnation for academic misconduct, enrollment fraud, financial scandals or other serious violations in the past three years.

(5) Recommendation or review: The application shall be either recommended in writing by an existing institutional member (accredited member or full member) or directly reviewed and approved by the IAPUC Membership Qualification Review Committee. Applications recommended by accredited members are eligible for an expedited review channel. The recommending member shall confirm substantive understanding of the applicant institution through academic exchanges, regional cooperation, peer visits or other practical interactions, rather than generalized recognition based solely on public information. Recommending members shall not be liable for guaranteeing the authenticity of application materials.

Full membership is valid on a long-term basis, subject to sustained compliance with qualification criteria and timely annual fee payment.

Article 5 Accredited Membership Qualifications

(1) Accredited membership is exclusively obtained via automatic upgrade of full members upon acquisition of IQA accreditation, with no independent application procedure available.

(2) A full member shall be automatically upgraded to accredited member status on the effective date of the IQA accreditation decision (including provisional, formal and full accreditation).

(3) The validity period of accredited membership is synchronized with the validity period of IQA accreditation. Membership status shall be adjusted in accordance with the following rules upon changes in accreditation status:

- Accreditation upgrade (e.g., from provisional to formal accreditation, or formal to full accreditation) shall result in automatic continuation of accredited membership with corresponding adjustment of member rights in line with the accreditation level;
- Invalidation, expiration or revocation of accreditation shall trigger automatic

downgrade from accredited member to full member status (if the institution continues to meet full membership criteria); institutions failing to maintain full membership qualifications shall apply for downgrade to associate member or membership withdrawal within 30 days.

Article 6 Associate Membership Qualifications

Institutions applying for IAPUC associate membership shall meet the following criteria:

(1) Legitimate operation: The applicant is a legally registered and operational private vocational education institution, training institution, corporate university, education industry association, edtech company, education research institution or other institution closely related to private higher education.

(2) Relevant business scope: The institution's core business is substantially related to talent cultivation, educational services or academic research in private higher education.

(3) Concept recognition: The institution recognizes IAPUC's mission and core values.

(4) Standardized operation: The institution has no major illegal violations or serious reputation-damaging conduct in the past three years.

Associate membership is valid on a long-term basis, subject to sustained compliance with qualification criteria and timely annual fee payment.

Accreditation Restrictions for Associate Members:

- Associate members are not eligible to apply for IQA accreditation;
- Associate members intending to apply for IQA accreditation must first apply for and obtain full membership status;
- Upgrade to full membership requires full compliance with the criteria specified in Article 4 of these Regulations, particularly the possession of legitimate degree-granting rights or equivalent qualifications. Preparatory work completed by associate members for accreditation application (such as internal quality assurance system construction and self-evaluation initiation) prior to upgrade shall be recognized after obtaining full membership status to avoid repetitive work; however, formal accreditation applications may only be submitted after the effective date of full membership qualification.

Article 7 Individual Membership Qualifications

Natural persons applying for IAPUC individual membership shall meet all of the following criteria:

(1) Employment qualification: The applicant is currently a full-time faculty member, researcher or administrative staff of a formal and legitimate university, college or higher vocational education institution (not limited to IAPUC institutional member units. Current members who lose employment qualification due to retirement,

resignation or job transfer may retain their membership for one full payment cycle as a one-time transitional arrangement, rather than permanent retention).

(2) Professional background: The applicant is engaged in higher education-related teaching, research, administration or quality assurance work, and generally holds a master's degree or above or equivalent professional qualification. The degree requirement may be appropriately relaxed for practitioners with outstanding contributions and influential achievements in higher education, subject to confirmation by the Membership Qualification Review Committee.

(3) Concept recognition: The applicant recognizes IAPUC's mission and core values.

(4) Professional conduct: The applicant has no academic misconduct, professional misconduct or other serious reputation-damaging conduct in the past three years.

Individual membership is valid on a long-term basis, subject to sustained compliance with qualification criteria and timely annual fee payment.

Chapter III Membership Rights and Obligations

Article 8 Rights of All Types of Members

Voting Right Rules:

- Full members and accredited members each hold one vote at the IAPUC Annual General Meeting. Voting rights are conditional on valid membership status and full payment of annual fees for the current year.
- The voting right of institutions downgraded from accredited members to full members due to accreditation invalidation remains unaffected.
- Recommendation of new member applications by accredited members does not increase the voting weight of the recommending institution; each institutional member retains one independent vote with no additional voting rights generated by

recommendation relationships.

Governance Participation Explanation for Individual Members:

- Individual members may serve on IAPUC professional committees (e.g., Academic Committee, Professional Development Committee) to contribute professional expertise to association academic and operational activities, but committee membership does not confer voting rights at the Annual General Meeting.

Article 9 Obligations of All Types of Members

(1) Common Obligations for All Members:

1. Abide by the IAPUC Constitution, membership codes and all association resolutions;
2. Pay annual membership fees in full and on time;
3. Safeguard IAPUC's reputation and refrain from any conduct that harms the association's interests or reputation under the name of membership;
4. Promptly update IAPUC with major institutional or personal information changes;
5. Prohibit the transfer or lending of membership qualifications to third parties.

(2) Additional Obligations for Accredited Members:

1. Continuously comply with all norms and ongoing supervision requirements of the IQA accreditation system;
2. Use accreditation marks in strict accordance with the *IQA Accreditation Mark Usage and Brand Management Code*.

(3) Special Obligations for Associate Members:

1. Refrain from any form of publicity or public statement that implies or may mislead the public into believing the institution holds IQA accreditation;
2. Report to IAPUC within 30 days if major business scope changes result in non-compliance with associate membership criteria.

Chapter IV Membership Fee Standards

Article 10 Fee Formulation Principles

IAPUC membership fee standards adhere to the following principles:

- (1) Cost coverage and sustainability: Membership fees cover operational costs of member services and association development investments;
- (2) Tiered rationality: Fee standards are matched with membership category, institutional scale and entitled rights;
- (3) International comparability: Fee levels are benchmarked against international peer associations including AACSB, AMBA & BGA and ACBSP to establish

competitive and reasonable mid-range standards;

(4) Regional equity: Full consideration is given to disparities in economic development levels across countries and regions to avoid disproportionate financial burdens on members based on geographical location.

Article 11 Institutional Membership Fee Standards

The annual membership fee standards for IAPUC institutional members are specified below (all amounts in US dollars):

Accredited member fees consist of two independent components: IQA annual accreditation fee (implemented in accordance with the *IQA Internal Financial Regulations*) and accredited member annual fee (specified herein).

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Notes:

- Student enrollment of accredited members includes the total FTE students of all campuses and operational branches;
- Accredited member fees and IQA accreditation fees are issued with separate official receipts for independent accounting purposes;
- Dual membership status as both full member and accredited member is not permitted; accredited member status replaces full member status with no duplicate membership fees incurred, while independent accreditation fees remain applicable.

Notes:

- FTE student enrollment is based on the official statistical data of the most recent complete academic year submitted at the time of application;
- Total student enrollment of multi-campus institutions is calculated as the sum of students across all campuses;
- Full members obtaining IQA accreditation shall pay fees in accordance with the accredited member standard starting from the next fiscal year.

11.4 International Fee Level Benchmarking

IAPUC adopts reasonable mid-range fee standards to maintain competitiveness and accessibility among international peer organizations.

Article 12 Individual Member Fees

The standard annual fee for individual members is 100 US dollars. The following applicants are eligible for fee reduction or exemption:

- (1) Applicants from United Nations-recognized Least Developed Countries (LDCs): Annual fee reduced to 50 USD;
- (2) Full-time doctoral students: Annual fee reduced to 40 USD;
- (3) Individuals with special contributions to the association or other eligible circumstances recognized by the Membership Qualification Review Committee: Case-by-case fee reduction or exemption applicable.

Article 13 Fee Payment Rules

(1) Membership fees are paid annually. The fiscal year aligns with the calendar year, or adopts a rolling calculation based on the membership approval date. First-year fees are charged proportionally based on remaining months from the approval date to the end of the current fiscal year; full annual fees apply starting from the next fiscal year.

(2) Annual renewal fees shall be paid before the annual payment deadline. Membership status shall be automatically suspended if fees are overdue for more than 90 days without approved deferment. Suspended membership may be reinstated within 120 days upon full payment of outstanding fees plus a 10% late payment penalty. Membership status shall be permanently terminated if fees remain unpaid for more than 180 days; terminated members shall reapply for membership to regain eligibility.

(3) Newly admitted institutions shall pay the first-year membership fee within 30 days of application approval. Membership status takes effect officially upon confirmation of fee payment.

(4) Fees may be paid via bank transfer, online payment or other IAPUC-authorized payment methods. All payments shall be credited to the designated IAPUC membership fee account. Paid fees are generally non-refundable, except for duplicate payments.

Chapter V Membership Admission and Approval Procedures

Article 14 Institutional Member Admission Procedures

(1) Procedures for Full Members and Associate Members:

1. Application Submission: The institution submits a membership application form and relevant qualification certification materials to the IAPUC Membership Qualification Review Committee;

2. Qualification Review: The Membership Qualification Review Committee completes the review within 45 days upon receipt of complete application materials and may request supplementary documents when necessary;
3. Approval Decision: Approved applications are formally ratified by the IAPUC Council; rejected applications are notified in writing with detailed reasons;
4. Fee Payment: The applicant pays the first-year membership fee within 30 days of approval; membership status takes effect upon payment confirmation;
5. Certificate Issuance: IAPUC issues a full member or associate member certificate to the approved institution.

(2) Procedures for Accredited Members:

Full members are automatically upgraded to accredited members upon obtaining IQA accreditation. IAPUC issues an accredited member certificate within 30 days of the effective date of the accreditation decision with no additional application required.

Article 15 Individual Member Admission Procedures

- (1) Application Submission: The applicant submits an individual membership application form, employment certificate and professional qualification certification to the IAPUC Membership Qualification Review Committee;
- (2) Qualification Review: The Membership Qualification Review Committee completes the review within 30 days upon receipt of complete application materials;
- (3) Fee Payment: The approved applicant pays the first-year membership fee;
- (4) Status Activation: Individual membership takes effect officially upon payment confirmation, and IAPUC issues an individual member certificate.

Article 16 Membership Status Change and Withdrawal

- (1) Institutional members shall notify IAPUC in writing within 30 days of any major institutional changes (e.g., institutional name, legal representative, school-running license status).
- (2) Members may voluntarily withdraw from membership by submitting a written withdrawal notice 30 days in advance. Paid membership fees are non-refundable upon withdrawal.
- (3) Members failing to meet current membership category criteria shall actively apply for membership category adjustment or withdrawal. For inactive non-compliance, the IAPUC Membership Qualification Review Committee may initiate membership category adjustment or termination after verification.

Chapter VI Membership Services and Rights Protection

Article 17 Exclusive Member Services

IAPUC provides the following exclusive services to all members, constituting the core value of IAPUC membership:

(1) Knowledge and Information Sharing:

- Regular subscription to IAPUC publications including *International Observation on Private Higher Education* and *Frontiers of Quality Assurance*;
- Free or preferential access to IAPUC research reports, industry white papers and best practice case collections;
- Access to member-only online knowledge bases and accreditation resource platforms.

(2) Professional Development and Network Resources:

- Eligibility to participate in IAPUC annual conferences, regional forums and thematic seminars at preferential member rates;
- Access to IAPUC professional networks and peer exchange groups to facilitate international cooperation and experience sharing;
- Individual members may apply to join IAPUC professional committees to participate in association governance.

(3) Accreditation and Quality Improvement Support:

- Full members enjoy exclusive accreditation preparation advantages including procedural guidance, self-evaluation coaching and priority review scheduling for IQA accreditation applications;
- Accredited members have the right to participate in IQA standard revision consultations, accreditation calibration conferences and prominent display on the official IAPUC website.

(4) Promotion and Influence Enhancement:

- Institutional members are listed in the official IAPUC member directory for global exposure;
- Accredited members are entitled to use IQA accreditation marks to enhance global institutional credibility.

Article 18 Exclusive Accreditation Benefits for Full Members

Full members enjoy the following exclusive accreditation benefits unavailable to non-member institutions:

- (1) Exclusive accreditation preparation resources: Access to IQA self-evaluation toolkits, standard interpretation documents and demonstration cases restricted to members only;

- (2) Professional guidance and consultation: Eligibility to request accreditation preparation guidance from the IQA Office prior to formal application (with limited annual frequency/duration);
- (3) Peer network resources: Access to the IAPUC member network to connect with accredited institutions and learn accreditation preparation experience;
- (4) Priority review scheduling: Full member accreditation applications are prioritized for review scheduling under equal application conditions.

Chapter VII Supervision and Violation Sanctions

Article 19 Membership Qualification Review Committee

IAPUC establishes the Membership Qualification Review Committee with the following responsibilities:

- (1) Review of new membership applications and qualification verification;
- (2) Regular review of ongoing membership qualification compliance;
- (3) Investigation of suspected violations of membership codes;
- (4) Submission of membership adjustment or termination recommendations to the IAPUC Council.

Article 20 Violation Sanctions

Members violating these Regulations or the IAPUC Constitution shall be subject to the following tiered sanctions based on violation severity:

- (1) Written reminder;
- (2) Suspension of partial membership rights (valid for 3–12 months);
- (3) Membership downgrade (e.g., accredited member to full member, full member to associate member);
- (4) Permanent membership termination.

Sanction decisions are proposed by the Membership Qualification Review Committee and implemented upon deliberation and approval by the IAPUC Council. Sanction decisions shall be notified in writing to the involved member with detailed reasons. Members disagreeing with sanction decisions may submit an appeal to the Appeal and Arbitration Committee within 30 days of notification receipt.

Chapter VIII Supplementary Provisions

Article 21 Correlation with Other Normative Documents

Document Name	Correlation with These Regulations
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<i>IAPUC-IQA Accreditation Manual</i>	The "Full Member → Accreditation Application → Accredited Member" pathway established in these Regulations is fully aligned with the accreditation application eligibility criteria specified in the Accreditation Manual.
<i>IQA Internal Financial Regulations</i>	IQA annual accreditation fees and IAPUC membership fees are charged and managed independently in accordance with respective institutional regulations.
<i>IQA Accreditation Appeal, Complaint and Dispute Resolution Management Measures</i>	Member appeals against membership sanction decisions shall be governed by these Measures.

Article 22 Interpretation and Revision

- (1) These Regulations shall be exclusively interpreted by the IAPUC Council.
- (2) Revisions to fee standards require approval by a two-thirds majority vote of the IAPUC Council. Revised fee standards shall take effect from the next fiscal year with no retroactive application.

Article 23 Effectiveness and Transitional Provisions

- (1) These Regulations shall come into force officially upon approval by the IAPUC Council.
- (2) Institutions holding valid IQA accreditation prior to the implementation of these Regulations shall be automatically converted to accredited member status with no reapplication required.
- (3) Existing IAPUC member institutions without accreditation at the time of implementation shall be reclassified as full members if meeting full membership criteria, or associate members if only satisfying associate membership requirements.
- (4) All fee payments commencing from the effective date shall comply with the new fee standards specified herein.

Appendix A: Institutional Membership Application Form

The application form shall include the following contents:

1. Official institutional legal name and registration information;
2. School-running license or equivalent qualification certification;

3. Scope and legal basis of degree-granting rights;
4. Student enrollment scale and discipline configuration;
5. Brief introduction of school-running history and management structure;
6. Recommending institution information (if applicable);
7. Self-declaration (concept recognition and no major violation record);
8. Authorized representative signature.

Appendix B: Individual Membership Application Form

The application form shall include the following contents:

1. Basic applicant information;
2. Employment institution and position certification;
3. Educational background and professional qualifications;
4. Self-declaration (concept recognition and no professional misconduct record);
5. Applicant signature.
